
♦ If you are attending Sit 'n Sew the rest of the day, you only pay the \$5 once.



Q&A:

Can I bring my 301? NO. Many of you have asked whether this class would also cover the Singer 301 models. NO! The only similarity is that they use the same bobbin and bobbin case. That is a separate class, to be held at a later date.

Will Gwen help me fix my machine? NO. Gwen will not be fixing/repairing your machine for you – she is going to encourage us to tackle our own machines with confidence, leading us step by step on how to keep our babies humming along like the design marvels they are. Roll up your sleeves and be prepared to get dirty – this is a hands-on class.



Can I bring my new, plastic Featherweight that was recently released? NO. This class is only for the vintage Featherweights produced through the 1969. Do not bring other machines to this class.

Supply List:

- ♦ Needle, thread and scraps to test stitches
- ◆ Large and small flat blade screwdrivers
- ◆ Flashlight
- ◆ Apron or old shirt this is messy!

- ♦ Pipe cleaners or chenille stems, if you have them
- ♦ Q-tips
- ◆ Rubbing alcohol

Additionally, we will continue to offer Friday Night Drive-In and other exciting opportunities to learn new techniques, improve skills, and share our love of quilting!

Friday Night Drive-In: The November 10 Friday Night Drive-In included a special focus on **Project Linus**. As part of the night's lesson, we provided fabric and demonstrated multiple ways to construct the selected mystery quilt block, the drunkard's path, in two sizes. Although many attendees admitted they were afraid of sewing curves, had never tried, or had given up in despair, the group eagerly tackled the project and there were an incredible number of blocks made. Those demo blocks have been assembled into at least three quilts, with more to come, to donate to Project Linus. Thanks to all who participated, and to **Marty Mansfield** for taking home and completing the rest of the unfinished blocks, and to **Ellen Anson** for assembling and quilting three quilts so far!











Strips 'n Strings Workshops: A Quilts of Valor Success Story!

Many guild members attended the Strips 'n Strings classes in early November, and a large number of students took advantage of the fabric kits provided by the guild to make patriotic blocks during the classes. These blocks will be assembled

into quilts for Quilts of Valor, and presented to area military personnel at a future date. But not all blocks followed this theme - there were some stunning blocks made in different colorways, too. 

The Splendid Sampler by Pat Sloan & Jane Davidson

"The Splendid Sampler by Pat Sloan and Jane Davidson has loads of interesting quilt blocks and a great back story. For one year, over 23,000 quilters from around the globe participated in the Splendid Sampler Quilt-Along on Facebook, sharing quilt blocks, stories, and camaraderie. The goal was to bring the whole world together to quilt and share the joys of a quilting life. The result was The Splendid Sampler with its one hundred blocks from eighty-three designers from around the world. There are blocks featuring piecing, appliqué, paper-piecing, and embroidery. Instructions are given, often with alternate colorways, for each block. Full-size patterns are pro-



vided as well as a gallery of sampler quilts featuring blocks made by the members – the Splendids. There are online resources for bonus blocks, tutorials, and settings for sampler quilts." Ann - Connecting Threads review

Minutes of the November 2, 2017 Guild Meeting from Ellen Anson

The meeting was called to order at 6:57 by President, Joan Smith. Beverly Williamson and Bitsey Rodgers presented a Qilt of Valor to Kenneth Larry Vox, an Army Veteran who was awarded the Purple Heart in addition to many other medals and citations. This is the 18th quilt awarded this year by ESQG.

The minutes from the October meeting were published in the newsletter. There were no corrections or additions to the minutes. A motion to approve the minutes as published was made by Bitsey Rodgers and seconded by Larry Cartwright.

Treasurer's report: Motion to approve was made by Shirley Willis and seconded by Claire Hallman.

There was no report from Director, Larry Cartwright.

Shirley Hamilton, VP of Special Programs, announced that the Strips and Strings classes will be held tomorrow and there are a few spots available in both classes. Those signed up are asked to arrive 45 minutes early to set up. Fabric will be provided if making a QOV block. Cutting instructions were sent out for those using their own fabric. Class is free but there is a kit fee plus donation to the church. Shirley announced that there is one donated spot available in the workshop and see her if interested. Friday Night Drive In for Nov. 10th has 30 signed up with space available for more. Those participating will learn how to make a block 4 different ways in two different sizes. Fabric will be provided to make Project Linus blocks to turn in. Participants may bring their own fabric to sew after donated blocks are made. The featherweight maintenance class will be held at the December Sit and Sew. The charge is \$5.00. Registrations for the borders class by Winnie Fleming will begin next week after board sets price.

Beverly Williamson, VP of Programs, showed her November acorn block and the two December blocks, Christmas ornament and snowman. The annual Christmas dinner as well as the challenge reveal will be at the December meeting. A sign up sheet was passed around. Beverly asked that members "pack a purse" for ladies homes donations. Buy a purse and pack with personal items such as scarf, gloves, etc. Non-perishable food items and toiletries will also be collected.

Linda Stuzman, library, had no report.

Sit and Sew chair, Janet Mikes, announced that the next event will be November 11th 9-3 the day after Friday Night- Drive-In. Fee is \$5.00 and is at Valley Christian Church.

ME Spencer is taking registrations and money for the New Years Bash.

Bitsey Rodgers, Project Linus chair, reported that 4 qullts were donated tonight. There will be a drawing next month for those turning in quilts over the last few months.

Becky Hanks has collected 5 sets of friendship blocks for members who have lost a loved one in recent months. Blocks can still be turned in. They will be given out next month.

Newsletter, Beverly Williams, had no report.

Membership chair, Laurie Smith reported that there were 65 members, and 1 new visitor present, Door prizes were drawn for.

There was no new or old business.

After show and tell, Beverly Williamson introduced sisters, Barbara and Virginia, from Strips and Strings, who presented a program about foundation piecing string quilts and showing a number of the quilts featured in their book. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10.

Background fabric: $24 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ squares and 8 - 3 squares

Cardinal Body Red fabric: $6-2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 4-3" squares

(will make 2 blocks each with 1 leftover) Cardinal Face Black fabric: $1 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " square Cardinal Beak Orange fabric: $1 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " square

Leaves: 4 – 3" squares (will make 2 blocks each with 1 leftover)



Cardinal Body: sew four 3" red squares right sides together to four 3" background squares, drawing a line down the center from corner to corner and then sewing ¼" on each side of the drawn line and then cut apart on the drawn line and press open.

Sew Line

Cut Line

In this same way, sew four 3" leaf fabrics to four 3" background fabrics for the leaves.

Cardinal Face: Sew a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " red fabric to a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " black fabric right sides together drawing a line from one corner to the other and SEW ON THE LINE and then cut $\frac{1}{2}$ " to one side, press open the remaining side. Sew Line $\frac{1}{2}$ Cut Line



In this same way, sew one 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " orange fabric to a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " background fabric for the beak.

Now sew your two-toned (red and black) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " face square to a red 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square drawing and sewing on a line drawn down the center from corner to corner. In the same way, sew the two-toned (orange and background) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric to a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " background fabric.



*****BEFORE YOU CUT THESE LAST TWO BLOCKS --- <u>BE SURE</u> you have the black fabric and the orange fabric in the correct position for placement or they will be upside down! So, when you open and look at the face block, the black portion should look like this:

Then cut away the other side.

And the beak block opened should look like this: And cut away the other side.



Sew blocks together in horizontal rows according to the picture.
