
The table for tickets will be in the rear of the meeting room just after membership, so sign in and move left and get your tickets.

Minutes of the February 1, 2018 Guild Meeting from Ellen Anson

ESQG General Membership Meeting, Feb. 1. 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:59 by President, Joan Smith.

The minutes were posted in the newsletter. There were no corrections or additions to the minutes. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. The motion passed.

December's treasurer's report by Bitsey Rodgers: Beginning balance of \$19718.18, deposits of \$11672, expenses of \$1164.95, with an ending balance of \$20225.23. A motion to accept the treasurer's report was made and seconded. The motion passed.

VP of Special Events, Shirley Hamilton, reported that Friday Night Drive In was a success with paper piecing technique. Flavin Glover's workshops in March are almost full. There are two spots left in Friday and 5 in Saturday and they are now open to nonmembers. If interested, contact Shirley.

Director, Larry Cartwright reported that he will be distributing tickets for the opportunity quilt next month.

Piecemakers chair, Shelby Looney announced the following dates for Piecemakers through the year: April 6th and 7th, July 20th and 21st, and October 26th and 27th. Shelby passed out cards with Piecemaker's dates as reminders. Sign up is being taken now for the April Piecemaker.

Bitsey Rodgers, Project Linus chair, reported that 8 quilts were turned in tonight. There will be a drawing next month.

Sit and Sew chair, Janet Mikes, reported that the February Sit and Sew will change from the 2nd Saturday to the 3rd Saturday to Feb. 17th, due to a conflict with the church. March through December Sit and Sew return to the 2nd Saturday of each month. Kathi Seymour will offer a mini class on English paper piecing at the March Sit and Sew. There will be no additional cost for this and Kathi will provide kits. Eileen Moore announced that Borders Bee, group 2 will start in March as part of Sit and Sew. There are currently 20 signed up. Contact Eileen if interested.

Stephanie Newman, Retreat chair, reported that there are 9 signed up for the March 8th – 111th retreat at Sunset Inn. There are 12 needed for the retreat to be held. Contact Stephanie to sign up.

Joan Smith presented the following 6 guild members who had lost family members with friendship blocks: Elaine Rasko, Sheryl Simpson, Laurie Smith, Claudia Weber, Judy Buster, and Carol Harmon.

Membership chair, Lorrie Thomas, assisted by McCartney Newman, announced that the directory is printed and thanked Becky Seitel for her help with that. Members were encouraged to pick up a copy of the directory by the end of meeting. Name tag pins can be ordered at a cost of \$10.00. Those wearing name tags each month are entered in the monthly door prize drawing. There are currently 118 members. Present at tonight's meeting were 62 members, 3 new members and 2 visitors for a total of 67 attending.

Shirley Hamilton shared the sewing machine name tag that was shown at the Friday Night Drive-In.

Joan Smith announced that former member, Sheryl Cole, has been released from the hospital and is now on hospice care.

Elaine Moore thanked Melissa Martin for quilting the opportunity quilt, and Ella Thomas for making the label. The quilt was on display at the meeting.

There was no old business.

New business: Ellen Anson announced a "teaser" regarding the upcoming challenge to be presented at the March meeting and displayed at the September meeting. Ellen gave the hint – the inspiration will come from "between the covers.

Beverly Williamson showed the February heart block, and a kite and shamrock for March. Patterns will be in the newsletter. After show and tell, Beverly Williamson, VP of Programs, presented a demonstration of discharge dying.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:55.

It's Challenge Time Again!!!!! From Ellen Anson — Get your creative juices flowing for another exciting challenge. Sign up will begin in March and the challenge entries will be revealed in September. Read on for all the rules and criteria:

Challenge 2018 - "Between the Covers"

Purchase a "mystery" book for \$2.00.

Do NOT share what book you have with anyone or any information about your challenge – we want it to be a mystery for everyone during voting!

You must get the inspiration for your entry from anywhere between the covers of your book. You do not have to make something exactly from the book, just be inspired by something in the book. Use your imagination!!

There is no required fabric.

Must be a quilt – three layers – and must be finished.

Entry must be no larger than 160 inches on total outside edges (Examples: no larger than 40 \times 40, 20 \times 60, octagon with each side totaling 20 inches, circle that is 160" in circumference, etc). There is no minimum size requirement - teeny tiny is always good:)

A sleeve is not required.

The page number on which your inspiration was taken must be represented on the front of the quilt (actual number can be appliqued, printed on; represented by the number of a specific item, embellishment, or number of pieces in the quilt). Again – use your imagination!

Turn in BEFORE the September meeting – may be turned in at any guild meeting prior to September or guild event such as August Sit and Sew. For later turn in before September meeting, make arrangements with Ellen Anson. Must turn in both the completed item and the completed entry form that was given to you when you bought your book (I will have extra forms if you lose yours). The book is yours to keep.

Must be in a pillowcase or bag so that it cannot be seen by others when turned in.

Must attach your name on the back - does not have to be covered up.

Quilts will be displayed at the September meeting. Awards will be given for Viewer's Choice, Best Inspiration, and Best Representation of Page Number.

Director's Notes by Larry Cartwright

A recent comment turned in to the suggestion box:

"What is the sense of having to pay or sign up for Drive In if after it is over with the patterns and/or instructions are given out online?

One would think the object is to show up and be surprised and then just post pics of what was done and then those who don't participate might feel like "wow, I really missed out I will go next time!"

Just saying....."

We turned to Shirley Hamilton and Kathi Seymour, who lead the Friday Night Drive-In sessions, to address this:

First and foremost, the pattern was already available online, free, from the designer. Yes, anyone could have found the pattern and stayed at home and made the blocks on their own, without attending Drive-In. That remains an option.

Drive-In was conceived as "Friday Night at the Movies." From the very beginning, the idea has been to take a pattern or lesson that is freely available online, show it on the screen, and then tackle the project as a teaching opportunity in a group setting. We build skills, learn new techniques, explore options. We talk about contrast, color choices, setting possibilities. We stress the importance of sewing an accurate \(\frac{1}{2} \) seam. We show six ways to sew a curve. We show how to cut the same pattern with ruler, templates, and AccuQuilt. We talk about bias, starch, and colorfastness. We discuss tips and tricks. We offer money-saving and time-saving advice. This is what you get from attending. The value is in

sharing knowledge, learning together, and embracing something that intimidated us. Just ask folks who had never sewn curves or had never paper-pieced a block - folks who would not have come, nor tried it, if they had known what the project for the night was!

To avoid copyright violations, we did contact Cath of Wombat Quilts and received permission to make photocopies of the pattern for the class, to share the pattern with our members, to teach her method, to show her website/blog during class, and to use her resources to spread the joy of paper piecing.

In exchange for this FREE class, which requires immense amounts of time and effort on our part to plan, organize and present, we ask that \$5 be donated to the church where we meet. For the January 26th Drive-In, we charged a \$10 kit fee that included a ruler that retails for \$11, a glue stick, a folding tool, fabric, copies of the pattern, a master sheet for reprints, fabric calculations and cutting instructions, and bonus flying geese paper piece patterns.

> We brought in dinner. We socialized. We laughed. And along the way, we learned.

We have failed miserably if the value of attending is lost on anyone who has participated. And yes, you are absolutely right – we want folks who didn't attend to catch the excitement – to realize that "wow, I really missed out; I WILL go next time!"


